EXECUTIVE COURSE IN NATIONAL SECURITY, PEACE AND CONFLICT RESOLUTION

Introduction

Mozambique – Tanzania Centre for Foreign Relations (CFR) is one of higher learning institutions in Tanzania, teaching international relations and diplomacy. The Centre was established in 1978 following an agreement between the governments of the Republic of Mozambique and the United Republic of Tanzania. The Centre enjoys diplomatic status incorporated in Immunities and Privileges Act No. 5 (1986). The Centre provides high quality and competitive training, research, and consultancy services and short courses in the fields of International Relations and Diplomacy, Economic Diplomacy, Languages and Communication Skills as well as Strategic Studies

Course Objectives

The aim of this executive course is to expose the participants to key issues related to national security, peace and conflict resolution. Specifically, they will learn about international and regional security dynamics and their impact on nations. Amongst others, the participants will gain insights on the security challenges facing nations and mechanisms to promote peace and manage conflicts.

Target Audience

This Executive Course is designed for Senior Officers particularly, from the defence and security organs, senior security managers; directors, Chief Executive Officers, Commissioners, from both public and private sectors. The course does not require any prior educational background in matters of peace, conflict resolution and security rather, work experience and interest on such and related issues.

Expected Learning Outcomes

By the end of this executive training, participants shall be able to understand:

- National Interest;
- Identify security threats to African countries, particularly Tanzania;
- Frameworks for promoting peace and security in African nations;
- Describe security dynamics at the global, regional and national levels;
- Examine the nature of conflicts and evaluate mechanisms to resolve conflicts and to promote peace;
- Examine strategies to addressing global, regional and local security concerns.

Training Approach

Our team of experts in peace and security as well as conflict resolution will facilitate the training. Teaching and learning are designed to be participatory. Whereas facilitators will introduce main topics, participants will be fully engaged so that they share experiences, discuss facts on the topics and at times participate in role-playing and simulation exercises.

Course Duration

This is a 3-day full-time course. The course is scheduled to take place from Monday 25October toWednesday 27October2021. The programme will be availed to those who will confirm their participation. Any additional information will be provided during course registration.

Award

At the end of the course participants will be awarded a certificate of attendance.

Course Fees

Fees for the course are TSH. 650,000/=. These will cater for reading materials, tuition, breakfast, lunch and refreshments.
